Hailed as the most esteemed musical group in Cajun music, they take the rich Cajun traditions of Louisiana and meld them with Zydeco, New Orleans Jazz, Tex-Mex and Country Blues to form a heady musical stew. From the Grande Ole Opry and Newport Folk Festival to Carnegie Hall and *A Prairie Home Companion*, their music has captivated audiences the world over. This free in-the-park concert is sponsored by the Mayor, City Council and City of Fallon.

The T Sisters

Sassy sibling folk with amazing vocal harmonies, reminiscent of the Andrews Sisters, the sextet blends inventive songwriting and creative covers into a scintillating blend of Folk, Americana, Gospel, R&B and Bluegrass that is simultaneously modern and timeless. Pleasing crowds from Merlefest to the Strawberry and High Sierra Festivals, they have been hailed as one of 16 artists to watch in 2016.

The trio, with bassist Peter Washington and drummer Kenny Washington, is one of the leading ensembles in today's Jazz world.


Kahulanui

Known as Hawaii's Kings of Swing, these 2014 Grammy nominees blend traditional island music with the Big Band swing brought to the Aloha State by U.S. servicemen during World War II. The nine piece ensemble—four horns plus guitar, bass, ukulele, drums and steel—crafts new arrangements of vintage mid-century songs, utterly contemporary yet steeped in tradition.

A French-American electroswing pop band, the quintet crafts French songs with an American vibe, American songs with a tongue-in-cheek French touch. Time periods cross and inspirations collide—from Pop to old New York Swing with electro-beats thrown in for good measure.

A central casting inspired romantic, retro-Manhattan show that from the Montreux Jazz Festival to GloblaFest in NYC, has taken audiences on a swinging, swaying voyage across the musical decades.

The Other Mozart

There was another Mozart, a forgotten genius, Nanneri, the sister of Amadeus. This one-woman show from the Little Matchstick Factory, presents the true, untold story of this prodigy, keyboard virtuoso and composer. She performed throughout Europe with her brother, to equal acclaim, but has been lost to history. This visually opulent play was nominated for an Off Broadway Alliance Award for Best Solo Performance and won an Innovative Theatre Award in the same category.

Lakou Mizik

This multi-generational collective of Haitian musicians presents an electrifying live show that blends the spirit of a church revival, the social engagement of a political rally and the almost trance inducing intoxication of a Vodou ritual. The energizing rhythms and call-and-response vocals are supported by lilting accordions, interlocking guitar riffs and rocketing, poly-rhythmic rara horns. To Die For (1995) October 7, 2016


An aspiring, self-absorbed TV anchorwoman will do anything to remain in the spotlight, eliminating anything that might be in her way including hiring some teenage thugs to murder her husband. This film was directed by Gus Van Sant and features Nicole Kidman, Matt Dillon, Joaquin Phoenix and Casey Affleck. Kidman won the Golden Globe for Best Actress and was also nominated for New York Film Critics Circle and BAFTA awards.


The Hours (2002) October 14, 2016

A tale of how Virginia Woolf's story, "Mrs. Dalloway," affects three generations of women in different places, all of whom have had to deal with tragedy in their lives. Directed by Stephen Daldry, from a Pulitzer Prize winning novel by Michael Cunningham, the film stars Kidman, Julianne Moore, Ed Harris and Meryl Streep. It won several Oscars including Best Actress (Kidman), Picture; and, Supporting Actor (Harris) and Actress (Moore).



The Paperboy (2012) November 4, 2016

An idealistic reporter and his brother investigate a murder in trying to exonerate a man on death row, becoming involved with a vixen who'll do anything to set the man free. The film is based on a novel by Pete Dexter, and was directed by Lee Daniels and features Kidman, Matthew McConaughey, John Cusack, Zac Effron and David Oyelowo. It was nominated for the Palme d'Or at the Cannes Film Festival and Kidman also received a Golden Globe nomination for Best Supporting Actress.



Elmer Gantry (1960) February 3, 2017


A fast-talking, hard drinking traveling salesman joins up with a lay preacher whose hellfire and damnation revival is sweeping the country. Based on the novel by Sinclair Lewis, this film was directed by Richard Brooks and stars Burt Lancaster, Jean Simmons, Arthur Kennedy and Shirley Jones. It won Academy Awards for Best Actor, Supporting Actress and Screenplay and was also nominated for Best Picture. It also garnered a Golden Globe for Best Actor.

The Swimmer (1968) February 10, 2017

On a summer day, Ned Merrill suddenly appears at a friend's swimming pool and after a cocktail decides to swim his way home through the neighborhood pools. At each stop along the way, we learn a little more about his troubled life, a journey from fantasy to truth. The film is based on a John Cheever short story, directed by Frank Perry and stars Lancaster, Janet Landgard, Janice Rule and Marge Champion.



Atlantic City (1980) February 17, 2017

A small time hood and an oyster-bar waitress find themselves thrown together in an escapade that begins in a tattered apartment building just off the boardwalk and becomes an essay on the reincarnation of memories. Directed by Louis Malle, the film features Lancaster, Susan Sarandon and Kate Reid. It was nominated for five Academy Awards including Best Picture, Actor, Actress, Director and Screenplay and also won the Golden Lion at the Venice Film Festival.



Oats Park Renovation Project



Seating capacity on the main floor is 305 and all seats are reserved. If you'd like to request a specific seat please refer to the seating chart above. We'll do our best to accommodate your request, but cannot guarantee the availability of specific seats at any given performance. Please call 775.423.1440 or email charts@phonewave.net for all seating orders.

Seats will be assigned on a "first-requested, first-assigned" basis. Seating for patrons with special needs is available on both upper and lower levels of the house—please call in advance of the performance for more information. Assistive listening devices are also available upon request.

A limited number of box seats—six on the upper mezzanine level and four on the lower main level—can accommodate four to six persons. They may be purchased on an annual basis, and may be available for individual performances.

[Where the Hell is Fallon?]

It's not that far from where you are. The Oats Park Art Center is located at 151 East Park Street in Fallon, the Oasis of Nevada.

Fallon is 60 miles east of Reno, NV and is easily accessible from I-80 and Highway 50, the Loneliest Road in America. The center is located on the east side of Oats Park four blocks east of the junction of Highways 50 and 95. Detailed directions can be found by visiting either MapQuest or Google.
